## Scientific Quality

Dr Reichenbach is 50 years old and has obtained his Diploma of Medicine from Bern University in 1995, his Medical Doctor Degree in 1996, and his Habilitation in 2011. He completed his clinical postgraduate education and received Specialist Degrees in Internal Medicine (FMH) in 2002 and in Rheumatology (FMH) in 2007. Since 2001 he has worked in the Department of Rheumatology and Clinical Immunology and part-time as research fellow at the Institute of Social and Preventive Medicine. Between 2006 and 2008 he was a Clinical Research Fellow at the Clinical Research and Training Unit at Boston University. In 2008 he also obtained a Master's Degree in Epidemiology from the Boston University School of Public Health. Since his return to Bern in 2008, he has been working part-time as a Senior Physician (Oberarzt), since 2013 as a Consultant (Leitender Arzt) in the Department of Rheumatology and Immunology, and as the Head of the Musculoskeletal Health Research Group at the Institute of Social and Preventive Medicine. Since August 2015 he was a Consultant and deputy Director of the Institute for Primary Care (BIHAM), and Director ad interim from Feb 16- Mai 16. Since June 16 he joined with his Musculoskeletal Health Research Group again the Institute of Social and Preventive Medicine.

Dr Reichenbach is a respected expert in the field of osteoarthritis and giant cell arteritis epidemiology, especially in the research areas of synthesizing data on different therapies and the etiology of osteoarthritis and giant cell arteritis. He has been the principle or co-investigator of clinical trials, cohort studies, and systematic reviews including network meta-analyses that were funded by the Swiss National Science Foundation and the ARCO Foundation. He was last author of an investigator initiated clinical trial investigating tocilizumab as treatment option in giant cell arteritis, published in the Lancet. He has collaborations with Boston University, University of Bristol, University of Sydney, and University of Toronto.

Dr Reichenbach has been awarded four peer-reviewed research grant as lead applicant and four as co-applicant. His overall financial funding for grants has been CHF 1.52 Mio as the principal applicant and CHF 1.97 Mio in his role as co-applicant. This includes grants from the Swiss National Science Foundation, ARCO Foundation, AVINA Foundation, and NHMRC, Australia, among others, that have allowed the establishment of an osteoarthritis research group.

Dr Reichenbach contributes regularly to both undergraduate and postgraduate teaching activities, with lectures for 3<sup>rd</sup> to 6<sup>th</sup> year students in Bern, both in rheumatology and epidemiology, and for MSc students at the Bachelor and Masters programs in Biomedical Sciences of the Universities of Bern and

Fribourg. Dr Reichenbach regularly gives postgraduate seminars and presents at major international conferences, and is frequently asked to peer review articles in high-ranked specialist journals.
